Why hold public consultations on uranium?

Uranium exploration projects have raised concerns in several areas across Québec, namely in Mistissini.

In 2014, the Québec Government mandated the Bureau d'audiences publiques sur l'environnement (BAPE) to conduct an inquiry and public consultations on issues related to uranium development.

The BAPE Commission and a Commission of the James Bay Advisory Committee on the Environment (JBACE) are holding joint consultations on uranium issues for the JBNQA Section 22 Territory.

The registration of presenters before October 30th, 2014 will allow the BAPE and JBACE Special Commissions to plan the schedule and reserve specific time slots for these presenters. All presenters are welcome, but registered Presenters will receive priority.

Further, written submissions, extracts or summaries would be greatly appreciated before October 30th to allow the Commissioners to prepare questions for a potential dialogue with the Presenter. They can be sent by fax or E-mail.

The JBACE

The JBACE is a tri-partite committee, composed of representatives from the governments of the Cree Nation, Québec, and Canada.

The JBACE has the mandate to supervise the implementation of Section 22 of the JBNQA which establishes the environmental and social protection regime in the James Bay Territory.

The BAPE

The government of Québec created the BAPE to conduct public consultations on the environmental impacts of development projects and on environmental issues.

In some cases, the Québec Minister of the Environment mandates the BAPE to hold a province-wide inquiry and public consultation on a specific issue, such as uranium development.
