5- Recruitement of secretary

- 5.1 The candidate recommended by the Committee was unable to take up the post owing to administrative difficulties related to his transfer.
- 5.2 The Chairman of the Committee proposed various alternatives to the Ouébec Minister of the Environment (letter dated April 20, 1983 - document 29.5.2) which would allow for filling the post. In addition, a meeting between the MENVIQ Deputy Minister and C.R.A. representatives enabled the latter group to advise Mr. Meunier of the need to rapidly settle the difficulties in hiring a secretary and to acquaint him of their dissatisfaction with the evolution of this dossier. Recently, J. Piette also met with Mr. Meunier to discuss this question; the latter assured him that before the end of June he would provide a solution to enable his Ministère to hire a secretarv.
- 5.3 The Committee agreed to accord the MENVIQ an ultimate deadline. However, if an acceptable solution is not obtained by the end of June, the Committee will proceed to hire a contractual worker who would be in the employ of the C.R.A.

6- Lake Father - lisière

5.4 Mr. Gariépy proposed sending Mr. Meunier a letter to that effect.

The motion was proposed by J. Piette and seconded by G. Gantcheff.

6.1 At the recent meetings of the Examening Committee, the guestion of a dossier on the Doda Lakes, Anville, Father, etc. forest roads was raised. Although the members of the Examening Sub-committee favour the opening of these roads, they questioned the pertinence of granting lumber rights at the edge of the forests bordering the lakes, in view of their touristic, recreational and ecological potential (letter sent to A. Penn by J. Giquère, document 29.6.1). It was also reported that a outfitter in the region has made representations about this question. Further, it is common knowledge that these lakes are located on the trapping grounds of the Waswanipi Band.

The Committee suggested that the Sub-committee on Forestry make a more thorough investigation to determine if the Executive Committee

M.E.R. norms which regulate lumbering rights are adequate in view of the actual or potential utilization of these lakes by tourists and trappers.

To this end, the sub-committee could consult:

- the Waswanipi Band Council;
- the regional office of the Environment:
- the M.L.C.P.:
- the local organizations of hunters and fishermen;
- the area purveyors;
- the Chapais-Chibougamou C.E.R..

As proposed by Mr. A. Gariépy, the Committee will ask the Subcommittee on Forestry to present, at the next Committee meeting, recommendations relative to preserving the forests bordering the shores of the aforementioned lakes.

7- Local administrators

7.1 Administrative agreements were signed between the C.R.A. and the MENVIO and between the C.R.A. and Environment Canada relative to financing the activities of the Cree local administrators (Ref.: documents numbers 29.7.1 -29.7.2 - 29.7.3).

7.2 The local administrators assumed their duties on April 1, 1983, and were hired on the basis of 84 hours of service per month. The C.R.A. administers this program except for Waswanipi where the Band Council assumes that responsibility. However, in all the communities, the local administrator is responsible professionally to the Band Council.

Each village, with the exception of Némiscau and Fort Rupert, has a resident local administrator.

- 7.3 An ongoing practical training program has been set up for the local administrators. For this purpose, a committee was created to include C.R.A. representatives and representatives from both Environment Canada and the MENVIQ. A mechanism for ongoing evaluation was also initiated.
- 8.1 Pursuant to Mr. Johnny Mark's recommendation (document 29.8.1), the Wemindji Band Council will carry out this construction project.

The awards will be presented to the winners by the Minister of the Environment, Adrien Ouellette, during a regional tour. 10. Policy on the treatment of waste water

10.1 The Committee members looked at the project for a policy on the collection and treatment of waste water North of the 51st parallel as submitted by Mr. A. Gariépy.

The comments about the document emphasize the need to minimize as far as possible the level of technology required to obtain acceptable results. Where feasible, priority must be given to using natural means such as peat bogs and swift-flowing rivers for treating waste water.

- 10.2 All recognize that such a policy must also take the needs of the milieu into consideration.
- 10.3 It was decided to refer this dossier to the Reglementation and Community Infrastructure Sub-committees whose members will be asked to examine this policy project to ensure that it adequately meets the needs of the Northern Québec environment and inhabitants.

- 11. Cree municipal infrastructures
- 11.1 Poste-de-la-Baleine: The Chairman informed the Committee that the Poste-dela-Baleine Crees intend to begin construction of a sewerage system to be linked up with the existing MPTA system (without initial treatment).
- 11.2 Wemindii: Construction work on an optional conventionanal-type lagoon has been suspended pending improved soil conditions. In the meantime, and because the linking of the system is completed, the untreated waste water is flowing into the mouth of the Maquatua river near the village of Wemindji.
- 11.3 Eastmain: The installation of a system of biodiscs is now underway.

12. Grande-Baleine Complex

12.1 P. Awashish gave a report on the recent meeting between the MENVIO and the C.R.A. representatives concerning the Grande-Baleine hydroelectric project. Hydro-Québec having indicated that it is no longer able to set a specific date for beginning the construction work,

the Crees addressed a letter to the Deputy Minister of the Environment stating that the project should not be examined any further. In their opinion, Hydro-Québec should recommence the entire procedure the day it decides upon a date to begin the work. They are still awaiting the Deputy Minister's reply.
