



## INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Strategic Plan 2010-2013 is to focus the initiatives of the James Bay Advisory Committee on the Environment (JBACE) on current and future issues and to identify issues requiring priority action in the years to come. The concerns of the JBACE are shaped by the current social and political context, and the next three years will be a pivotal period in terms of the parameters to be set for future developments in James Bay. The plan is based on the guiding principles of the environmental and social protection regime established under the James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement (JBNQA).

The JBACE has a mandate that involves a large area covering more than 400,000 km<sup>2</sup>, which calls for considerable challenges. One of the members' major concerns is the aging nature of the environmental assessment procedure. While being sensitive to the sociocultural context, the JBACE believes it is necessary to adopt modern methods based on internationally recognized practices. The Committee also sees an urgent need to innovate and to extend the field of environmental assessment so that it covers all strategic matters for the territory as a whole.

The general and specific objectives for the next three-year plan will ensure continuity of the work done by the JBACE with respect to application of Section 22, but will also aim to work upstream from several government planning procedures already undertaken for the James Bay territory, such as the Northern Plan, Bill 79 on mining, the overhaul of the forest regime and the land use plan for the territory. The JBACE will have to pay special attention to the ways in which these procedures overlap.

The JBACE will place priority on the following areas of interest in 2010-2013:

- **Update the environmental assessment procedure under Section 22** by revising the project lists and developing a procedural guide for public consultations in James Bay;
- **Sustain the compatibility of numerous Canadian and Québec laws, regulations and policies with the environmental and social protection regime under Section 22.** To that end, the JBACE must be involved in the revision processes early on. Recognition and collaboration on the part of the governments in this regard are therefore essential for all matters related to our mandate concerning the territory covered by the JBNQA.
- **Collaborate on the development of environmental management tools,** particularly with environmental protection bodies, to ensure that development under the Northern Plan, the overhaul of the forest regime, Bill 79 on mining, expansion of the road system and planning for the territory, including the land-use plan, are compatible with the provisions of Section 22 and protection of vulnerable species.
- **Develop an application framework for strategic environmental assessment (SEA) in the context of the Northern Plan proposed by the Québec government.**
